## Performance Improvement Modules Chart Review Requirements

### PROTECT Performance Improvement Modules (PIMs)

#### PROTECT ADULT IMMUNIZATION PIM

**Credit Offered:**

- *AMA PRA Category 1 Credits™*
- American Osteopathic Association Category 1-B Credit
- ABIM’s MOC Part IV

**Chart Review Requirements:** At least 25 valid patient charts reflecting adults with a high-risk condition who have recently been seen in your practice in Stage A, and an additional 25 charts in Stage C.

#### PROTECT ADOLESCENT IMMUNIZATION PIM

**Credit Offered:**

- *AMA PRA Category 1 Credits™*
- American Osteopathic Association Category 1-B Credit
- ABP’s MOC Part 4

**Chart Review Requirements:** For Stage A, you must review at least 20 valid charts reflecting adolescents who have turned age 13 within the past 2 years. During Stage C, you must review an additional 20 charts of adolescents who turn age 13 after you start Stage B of this activity.

#### PROTECT CHILDHOOD IMMUNIZATION PIM

**Credit Offered:**

- *AMA PRA Category 1 Credits™*
- American Osteopathic Association Category 1-B Credit
- ABP’s MOC Part 4

**Chart Review Requirements:** At least 20 valid patient charts reflecting young children who have recently turned age 2 years in Stage A and an additional 20 charts in Stage C.

**For ABP Diplomates Only:** This Performance Improvement Module (PIM) requires you to collect and report immunization rates on a total of 60 unique patient records to assess your performance improvement efforts at providing immunizations for children up to 2 years old. You must be an actively practicing physician with a sufficient number of young patients (target age of 2 years old) to report your data and complete the PIM’s baseline and two assessment cycles, and to be eligible for MOC credit with ABP.

The University of Nebraska Medical Center, Center for Continuing Education designates this PI-CME activity for a maximum of 20 *AMA PRA Category 1 Credits™*. Physicians should claim only the credit commensurate with the extent of their participation in the activity.
